Nutrition Education Coordinator **(Full-time)**

(Location: Charleston)

The Nutrition Education Coordinator will be responsible for the administration and implementation of nutrition activities funded through the federal SNAP-Education program in Berkeley, Charleston, and Dorchester counties. Coordinator will develop and maintain relationships with partners to conduct nutrition education. Coordinator will provide technical assistance and site monitoring to ensure effectiveness of SNAP-Ed program. She/he will assist with training and monitoring of new volunteers to teach SNAP eligible participants kids, teens, adults, and families. Coordinator will deliver nutrition education programs on an as-needed basis. She/he will capture pre and post-tests for evaluation, as well as assist in the collection of the Education and Administration Reporting System (EARS) data. Reliable transportation to travel to locations within the three-county area is required approximately 50% of the time.

The successful candidate must possess a bachelor's degree or equivalent years of education and experience in Dietetics, Public Health, and/or Health Education. A minimum of two years of relevant work experience in nutrition, human services, non-profit, social services, and/or customer service preferred. The candidate must have exceptional interpersonal, verbal and written communication skills. The Nutrition Coordinator must have a flexible schedule with availability to attend weekend and evening events as needed.
