Items in the monthly box include: canned fruit, vegetables, meat, cereal, juice, and cheese



Who can receive CSFP?

- Residents of Beaufort, Berkeley, Charleston, Colleton, Dorchester, Georgetown, Horry, Jasper or Williamsburg counties.
- 60 years of age or older
- Must meet the income guidelines created by USDA
